

# Site Plan




S = Sculpture





In the early days, when life in Sedona centered around farming and cattle, ranch hands would recite poetry and tell stories after a long day in the saddle. Cowboys would often show off a few rope tricks, too.

The bronze sculpture I will complete will stand about six feet tall and have a classic patina. His clothing, chaps, hat and boots will reflect that period in Sedona history.

Later, sculptures of children will be cast. Seated on logs, they will be listening to the tales of the cowboy.

Re: Letter of Support for Donation of a Sculpture to the City of Sedona


Dear Brynn:

Thank you for informing us that the Red Rock Arts Council (RRAC) would like to commission and then donate a piece of public art to the City of Sedona and have it placed in Jordan Historical Park. The RRAC was responsible for the "Sedona Schnebly" sculpture at the Library. This has proven to be a real asset to the community. A similar gift to Jordan Historical Park would be another generous gift and addition to the town and the park.

Minutes of Board Meeting  
June 15, 2011

**Members Present:** Bill Levengood, Jane Petty, Morna Paule, Janeen Trevillyan, Ray Anderson, Jim Eaton, Smiley Wyatt, Kathie Hamblin, Holly Shirley Willis

Also present was our new intern, Jennifer Ruiz

President Bill Levengood called the meeting to order at 9:07 a.m.

**Announcements:**

Bill Levengood, President, reviewed the Tuzigoot National Monument reopening celebration held on Friday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>. Recognition was extended to the Sedona Historical Society and Sedona Heritage Museum honoring Sherman Loy and SHS members with exceptional service. Bill accepted the plaque and pens on behalf of SHS given in appreciation for the many years of friendship and support in raising awareness of historic preservation and its value to the community. In addition to Sherman Loy, Donna Pratt, Jim Eaton, and Mary Smith Wyatt were also honored and presented with commemorative pen and pencil sets.

**Review and Approval of April 20th Board minutes: (Attached):**

- . Motion to approve April minutes as presented made by Donna Pratt and seconded by Patty Fox.
- . Motion to approve May minutes as presented made by Patty Fox and seconded by Janeen Trevillyan.

**Financial Review and Approvals (Attached):**

Kathie Hamblen reviewed the Administrator's Report including museum activities and upcoming weddings. Visitation at the museum is down significantly for the year, however income is up about \$3,000 due to the increase in admission fees. Holly Epright reports that the city, in general, has similar numbers of visitors but fewer are purchasing at businesses.

Bill presented the financial reports provided by Terry Greene and Ruth Clem. Net revenue is \$1,586.93. Bill also notes that additional revenue will be coming in as a result of the annual campaign.

- . Motion to accept the financial reports as presented made by Jane Petty, seconded by Janeen Trevillyan. Motion approved.

**City Update/Cowboy Sculpture:**

- . A motion was made by Jim Eaton and seconded by Janeen Trevillyan to write a letter of support indicating Board approval to the City of Sedona for the cowboy sculpture donated by the Red Rock Arts Council to be placed in the Jordan

Historical Park. Minutes of the Board (June 15, 2011) indicating board approval of placement will also be included with letter.

**Grant Status Updates:**

Janeen reports that there are three outstanding grants in progress.

>Arizona Historical Grant/Area of focus—conservation projects

> City of Sedona Grant/Areas of Focus:

. Veterans Day Celebration

. Possible source of funding for actors for radio show for Centennial Celebration, and Thompson Reunion Luncheon.

(Total for City Grant will include a Centennial package)

>Sedona Community Foundation Grant/Area of Focus—Capacity Building

. \$1,000 for website

. Consensus was reached to include an additional several thousand dollars for technology pieces, equipment additions and upgrades, lighting in packing shed and an annual sponsorship recognition format package (format possibilities, to be determined, include stationary or electronic).

Bill reviewed the Foundation Search information from the presentation viewed by the Ex. Comm. Members on June 1<sup>st</sup> noting the excellent potential for grants in the million-dollar range. Discussion included benefits of the Foundation Search Contract if Board members decide to pursue purchasing this service. Discussion followed including need for long term planning and grant administrators to direct any sizable proposed grant processes.

**Sunset Park/Cornhusk Dolls:**

Volunteers are needed to provide instruction in cornhusk doll making for about seventy-five people at Sunset Park for Friday evening Sept 23. Holly Epright, Jane Petty and Morna Paule volunteered to recruit, instruct and organize volunteers and materials in preparation for this event.

**Arizona Centennial Plans:**

Donna Pratt continues to be in contact with both Coconino and Yavapai Counties regarding their centennial plans. Janeen Trevillyan is attending City of Sedona HPC meetings to assist in coordination between the City Historical Preservation Commission and the Sedona Historical Society for Centennial planning.

Janeen Trevillyan discussed coordination with the Sedona Main Street Program for a Saint Patrick's Day celebration in 2012 involving the family members of J. J. Thompson as fitting both categories of Irish and first settlers. It was the consensus of the Board members that Janeen will begin to contact J. J. Thompson members. Consensus was also reached to add cost of this event to the City of Sedona Grant.

Janeen also requested ideas from members for names for the Bell Ringing Event.

Donna Pratt presented a dutch oven cooking event idea. This could be held some time in October or November at the Museum as part of the SHS Centennial Celebration. She described the credentials of member Grant Smith, pioneer descendant, and the awards he has consistently won for provision of his service.

Following discussion, a motion to direct Ex. Comm. members to make the final decision no later than at the August Ex. Comm. meeting (first Wednesday in August) to provide an Authentic Pioneer Dutch Oven cooking fundraiser was made by Donna Pratt and seconded by Jim Eaton. Decision is contingent upon acceptability of presented cost benefit ratio and details of service provision.

Volunteers are needed to come in early (9:00) for a City P&Rec "Adventure Hike" on July 9 and August 13 to be held on Jordan Historical Park grounds. This will involve a brief talk about the museum.

City of Sedona Parks and Recreation coordinator has also asked if costumes could be made available for another P&Rec event. Janeen Trevillyan will contact Beth Lanzoni about feasibility.

**Additional Business:**

Janeen will research Michael Peach as a possible speaker for the National Day of the Cowboy to be held at the Wayside Chapel.

Kathie Hamblin notes that the audit of the books has not yet been completed. Bill Levensgood notes that one more volunteer member to the audit committee is needed in addition to Loretta Benore and Shirley Willis. Jane Petty volunteered and Donna Pratt agreed to be a backup. Bill will coordinate the audit members to meet and complete the audit. (Subsequent to this meeting in Bill's absence, Shirley Willis coordinated members and the audit will take place at the museum on Friday June 24<sup>th</sup>.)

**Meeting was adjourned at 10:20 a.m. by consensus.**
